National Development/National Coach - Emma Wald



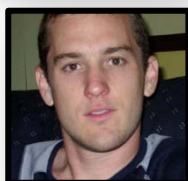

The Canopy Piloting Nationals were held at Sydney Skydivers' Picton DZ, NSW over the 19-21 February. The top eight finishers from the Open division, will compete as Australian representatives at the world championships in Russia, in August.

Canopy Piloting is contested over three disciplines of Speed, Distance and Accuracy, with placings awarded in each, plus overall. Intermediate level fielded nine, whilst the Open category produced a healthy 26 competitors!

- **Judging News from APF Director of Judges**

National Judging Matters

The series of Australian National Championships are just around the corner, and the following Chief Judges have been appointed to the respective Nationals:-

Dean Brook-Rerecich	<i>Canopy Piloting</i>
Jenni Plumridge	<i>Artistic Events, Canopy Formation, Formation Skydiving & Vertical Formation Skydiving.</i>

The judges are lining up and all Championships promise to be adequately staffed. All interested Trainee Judges are welcome and can confirm their attendance with Director of Judges Lindy Williams at lindyr@austarnet.com.au .

→ **The Online Judging Course** which was launched in the previous year met with some teething problems and was not accessible for much of the year. Elisabet Petterson, the creator of the Online Judging Course has worked steadily throughout the year to improve the course and iron out any glitches. The course is available again through the IPC website, and it must be noted that

the course does not qualify judges for an FAI Judges rating. Judges wishing to be FAI Trainee Judges must still follow the process and protocol set down firstly in the APF Sporting Code, followed by Section 5 of the FAI Sporting Code.

- **Revalidation of FAI Judges Ratings** – At the recent IPC Plenary Meeting the International Judges Committee presented an Online Judges Re-evaluation exam which was approved by the Plenary. The exam enables the candidate to revalidate their rating from their home country under the supervision of an approved third person. This new development will be of great value to our Australian FAI Judges.
- **Scoring Systems** - We have enjoyed the benefits of Omniskore for over a decade, but sadly Omniskore is now being regarded as cumbersome and old technology. The International Parachute Commission has developed a plan to investigate and commission a replacement scoring system to be used at future International Events. Two scoring systems were presented at the recent IPC Meeting. Both systems involve a software package which can be downloaded into the users own hardware. More information will follow as developments unfold.

- **Skydiver returns after a 30 years**



Last June Paul suggested to Allison that, "try skydiving as it could be life changing." And how.

Doug started skydiving in 1962, gaining an 'F' licence in 1973 – in the days when 1000 jumps was sure something! He gained APF Star Crest number 99 in 1975 and also became a Senior Instructor when static line reigned supreme.

He came out of a 30 year skydiving retirement recently to do some jumps so as to be able to jump with his daughter Allison. A week prior she didn't know of his jumping.

Paul and Doug did Allison's 99th and 100th jumps.

"It was incredible to do rel work with my daughter. When Paul came to Cairns in 1975 I was his Instructor. (I taught him all I knew which didn't take long.)" Douglas Irvin

- **Pseudoephedrine - banned substance**

The World Anti-Doping Agency has added pseudoephedrine to the 2010 Prohibited List. From 1st January 2010, pseudoephedrine, above a certain level in a drug testing urine sample, will be banned in-competition. 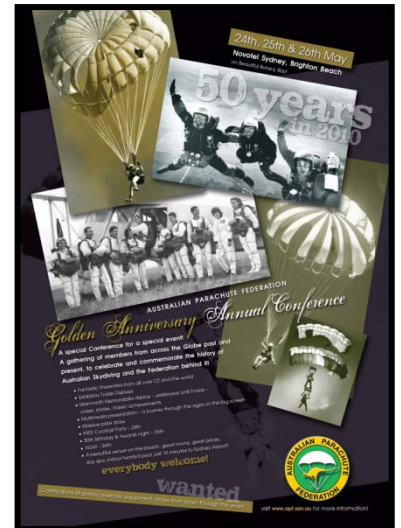

4. RIGGING ISSUES / SERVICE BULLETINS/ SAFETY BITS

- **Reserve Packing Cards**

Supplies of Reserve Packing cards are available for Packer As and Riggers from the APF office. Please contact Kim Hardwick, the Technical Officer to make request. technical@apf.asn.au

O.R. 7.4.1 Each emergency parachute, other than those referred to in 7.4.2, shall be accompanied by a reserve packing card which shows the make, type and serial numbers of the certified parachute parts (harness and reserve or emergency canopy), a record of work done, the signature and identification of the person who performed the work and the date on which the parachute was last certified as airworthy.

O.R. 7.4.3 If an automatic activation device (AAD) is fitted to activate the reserve parachute then the limits of its serviceability shall be recorded on the packing record. This must include Serial No's, make, model, Date of Manufacture, service expiry date and required battery change date as applicable.

Members: If your packing card is unable to clearly record all of these required details, please ask your packer to provide one.

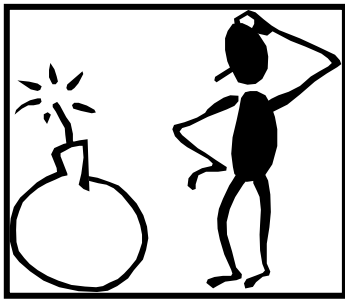
- **NEW** So do you feel you're invincible?

There was an AAD fire (CYPRES) over the weekend 20/21st February at a large multi faceted DZ in the southern half of Oz. This DZ has recently introduced mandatory AAD requirements for all jumpers. This particular member, an Instructor with no less than 20+ years in the sport had been fighting the AAD implementation. The CYPRES was fitted to his gear the day it fired. He had been questioning the hooking up of the lanyard – and elected not to, with the CYPRES fitted. On a jump, he experienced a bag lock malfunction, cutaway, and then decided to let the lanyard pull the reserve!!!!

The CYPRES fired and he was also lucky for a quick deployment as he was over the top of a 100 metre hill to the south of the DZ. A SAVE!

The CI is requiring the member to retrain in emergency procedures and select 50 experienced jumpers on the DZ and put them all through their emergency drills and get them signed off for their training.

What happens to us both physically and mentally when faced with the stress of dealing with a malfunction? The human body's response to a threatening situation is the release of adrenaline, a most powerful hormone. Adrenaline causes an incredible increase in both physical strength and pain tolerance, but it produces muscular trembling and the loss of some manual dexterity. The conscious ability to make correct decisions is diminished and tunnel vision occurs in extreme cases. Fright and panic brought on by the inability to accept sensory overload may cause an individual to momentarily freeze or become disoriented.




This partially explains why some jumpers cut away and don't pull the reserve, or pull reserves and do not cut away, or do nothing at all to deploy their parachutes. Thorough training, prior planning, being familiar with the operations of your equipment and a keen sense of awareness can prepare you to handle a malfunction wisely, swiftly and safely.

The preparation for handling a malfunction starts on the ground. Use all available training tools and information to learn a correct response and a plan that you will stick to in the air when you need it. Drilling emergency procedures on the ground until they become automatic, triggers muscle memory (and your body's ability to function independently from your conscious mind). Since conscious action may be limited in an emergency, malfunction procedures must be as simple as possible. Procedures then pretty much should stay the same throughout one's career. Equipment changes might require relearning and adapting new techniques.

What's happening in your pre plan if you now have that Skyhook device? Still planning on following through with your full emergency routine – pulling both handles? How current are you in your emergency procedures? Got an AAD? Two highly experienced Australian skydivers have had AAD saves in the last 12 months! Have a think about it.
